Below is your policy update for the week:

## I. SERVE Act

### • SERVE Act Cosponsor Additions

- Reps. Perlmutter (D-CO), Van Drew (R-NJ), Johnson (D-GA), Baird (R-IN), Harder (D-CA), Khanna (D-CA), Trone (D-MD).

### • Senate Armed Services Committee Hearing (summary attached)

- Earlier this week, SASC held a hearing on the FY22 military and civilian personnel programs in the Department of Defense (where the SERVE Act resides)
- Sen. Gillibrand (D-NY) pressed witnesses on servicemember/families lack of access to medical, behavioral, and mental health care, including stigma within the military accessing behavioral health services.
- Sen. Gillibrand also pursued a line of questioning about unfair recruiting standards that discriminate against female servicemembers.
  - **This included an exchange between the Senator and Lieutenant General David Ottignon on the inaccuracy of using BMI as an appropriate standard to measure fitness. A clip of this exchanged can be viewed [here](#).**

## II. Telehealth

### • Telehealth State Commercial Coverage & Payment Parity

### • FCC Broadband Benefit Program Open

- The benefit program allows eligible households to receive a \$50 per month subsidy for broadband service (\$75 for those on tribal lands), and a one-time \$100 discount for purchase of a computer or tablet.

### • Telehealth Flexibilities Post-Pandemic

- Congress is still negotiating on what a post-pandemic telehealth landscape will look like.

- A recent CBO score estimated that the removal of rural and home restrictions for mental health would increase spending by \$1.65 billion over 10 years.
  - The end-of-year spending bill lifted these restrictions under Medicare for mental health services, but added a provision requiring a doctor to have seen the patient in person within the previous 6 months.
- Stakeholders (including the REDC Consortium) look toward negotiating with Congress and the Biden administration to come up with some permanency in coverage and reimbursement either in a budget reconciliation package or an end-of-year spending bill.

### III. ACA

- **Energy & Commerce Hearing on FY22 HHS Budget (summary memo attached)**
  - Earlier this week, the House E&C Committee, Health Subcommittee held a hearing with HHS Secretary Becerra on the agency's budget request.
  - Secretary Becerra stated they're underway with a review of the Trump administration's short-term, limited duration insurance plans (STLDI) final rule.
- **HHS Reinstates Protections for Transgender Patients**
  - The Biden Administration stated it would enforce anti-discrimination protections for gay and transgender patients, reversing the Trump administration's narrowing of those protections.
  - The HHS civil rights office will again investigate complaints against health providers, insurers and others refusing to cover or provide care to transgender patients.

### IV. Parity

- **State Parity Call**
  - The full slide deck with an update on parity bills in the state are attached.
  - **Missouri: HB 889**
    - Passed the state house and is moving to the governor's desk to be signed into law.
    - Requires health insurers to comply with MHPAEA.
    - Gives Director the power to enforce and promulgate regulations.

  - The Kennedy Forum is hosting a webinar entitled, "Mental Health Parity: Ending Discrimination in Health Insurance Coverage" with Department of Labor Secretary Walsh, former Rep. Patrick Kennedy and NY State Office of Mental Health Commissioner Sullivan
